What is 'Joining the Dots'?

There are three children's hospitals in Dublin: Our Lady's Children's Hospital in Crumlin, Temple Street Children's University Hospital, and the National Children's Hospital in Tallaght.

Every year, these three hospitals care for thousands of children and young people. Some children and young people are treated in Accident and Emergency (A&E). Others go to hospital for an appointment with a doctor or for treatment where they need to be in hospital for the day. And some children and young people need to stay in hospital for a while to get the care and treatment they need.

In 2017, the three children's hospitals are taking part in a project called 'Joining the Dots'. This project is by:

- the Children's Hospital Group Board, which is working to develop a new children's hospital in Dublin, and
- the Ombudsman for Children's Office, which works to promote the rights of children and young people in Ireland.

'Joining the Dots' is an exciting opportunity to hear the opinions and ideas of children and young people in hospital about:

- what is working well?
- what, if anything, might be working less well?
- what changes, if they can be made, could help to make children and young people's experiences of hospital better?

By hearing the opinions of children, young people, parents/guardians and people working in the three hospitals, this project will:

- help the three children's hospitals to find out more about what's working well and what changes, if they can be made, could give children and young people a better experience of being in hospital
- help the Children's Hospital Group to take on board the views of children, young people, parents/guardians and people who work in the three children's hospitals as they make plans for the new children's hospital.

What does taking part involve?

This questionnaire is to help you share your opinions and ideas as part of this project. The questionnaire will take about 15 minutes to fill out. You don't need to fill out the questionnaire if you don't want to. If you would like to take part, please talk to your parent/guardian about it.




